IPSB Receives Transition to Teaching Grant

The IPSB has been awarded one of 93 grants from the US Department of Education to support transition to teaching. This five year federal grant is a statewide project to Stimulate Diversity in Urban and Rural Education. The IPSB is partnering with Calumet College of St. Joseph and the School City of East Chicago, Gary Community Schools and the School City of Hammond to increase the number of minority teachers in those schools. The partnership with Indiana University Southeast and the New Albany Public Schools, Clarksville Community School Corporation, and Scott County District 1 and District 2 will increase the number of minority and special education teachers. The Year 1 award is \$442,429 with a total of \$2,093,037 for the five year project.
