## **Prosoft Learning Corporation Establishes CIW Statewide Partnership with Indiana**

*State to Implement CIW in Public School Web-Related Curricula*

**Phoenix, Arizona - December 14, 2005** - Prosoft Learning Corporation, a learning solutions provider and the owner of the CIW certification program, today announced a partnership with the state of Indiana that will enable the incorporation of CIW curriculum in select high schools in fall 2006. Through the partnership with the Indiana Department of Education Office of Career and Technical Education (OCTE), Prosoft will provide curriculum and professional training throughout the implementation process.

Ten high schools are anticipated to be part of a three-year pilot program that will implement CIW's Internet-related technologies and business-practices curriculum in existing Web Design and Interactive Media courses beginning next fall. Prosoft will provide these schools with Official CIW Curriculum, assessment tools for more focused preparation for the CIW exams, and membership in the CIW Certified Testing Center (CTC) program that enables CIW exam testing in classrooms.
