JOURNALISM CAREER PATH MEETS ALL THE REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIANA'S CORE 40 & AHD DIPLOMAS

It may be adjusted for career emphasis

For this Career Path, Indiana Core 40 requirements may be interpreted as:

- ✓ English/Language Arts (8 credits) · which includes a balance of literature, speech, reading, writing, speaking, and listening
- ✓ Directed Electives (5 credits) · Journalism, World Languages, Career/Technical, Fine Arts

For the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma:

- ✓ Earn two Core 40 electronic media credits/ photojournalism credits/media graphics credits/fine arts credits
