I worked closely with another teacher in my content and another experienced teacher in another subject. They mentored me during my first two years.

My department head (department head of special education) really took me under her wing. She was not assigned to me as a mentor, but I worked closely with her and I would describe her as a mentor to others. She was always available to me for questions, PAR-ed my IEP conferences, assisted me in the IIEP program, and so much more. She would always check-up on me and make sure I was doing well and always asked if there was I had a mentor teacher in the same grade. I worked closely with my colleagues at my grade level.

The school corporation has a mandatory "New Teacher Academy," where new teachers meet with instructional coaches for a variety of instructional and informational workshops. The school itself has its own version of the New Teacher Academy, where administrators and teachers at the school provide the workshops.

My first year of teaching I was part of a Peer Assistance and Review program in which I was observed at least once a month by my mentor teacher to go over how I could improve my lessons, best strategy for classroom management, and any other issues that came up. During the Peer Assistance and Review I was able to go to classes about organizing the classroom environment for teaching and learning. I was also able to lean on my coworkers and principal for mentoring and support. They were very helpful and understanding of issues I had and helped me work through them. I felt very comfortable coming to them if I had problems with student behavior or classroom management. I felt like I was a valued individual in the school buildings and that I was always included in activities and meetings. I was able to give feedback at staff meetings freely and I was highly I met monthly with other mentees to discuss and share our experiences and I also spoke regularly with certified mentors other than the one I was assigned.

I worked very closely with almost all the teachers in the math department the past two years. I frequently asked teachers what methods worked for them as far as assessments, classroom management, and day to day classroom activities. Throughout the year, Twin Lakes High School provided opportunities (once every few months) for all new teachers to get together and learn about evaluations at Twin Lakes and other topics new teachers need to know. These sessions were hosted by veteran teachers who were able to answer questions all new teachers had. I also had various teachers (in all departments) who were constantly checking in with me and Along with a mentor teacher, I worked closely with my building administrators and professional development leaders to receive extra training as needed. My building administrator observed me often and we met several times to discuss my progress. I also observed fellow teachers, took notes on their instruction, classroom I would meet at least once a month with my mentor teacher for a short discussion and we would talk informally on a weekly/sometimes daily basis as needed. From Purdue I also received formal mentoring by videotaping a lesson and receiving feedback from a mentor/professor.
