Career and Technical Education (CTE) is rigorous and relevant education that, "impacts 94 percent of all high school students across the country" according to the Association for Career and Technical Education. Washington State reported that CTE is a wise investment, earning nine dollars in revenues and benefits for every dollar invested.

In Indiana, Career and Technical Education (CTE) is delivered through comprehensive high schools, co-op programs, and career centers. In CTE District 46, career and technical education opportunities exist in the comprehensive high schools and at the Southern Indiana Career and Technical Center. Every program of study is certified if such certification is available.

The career center is located in Evansville and offers 19 different programs of study ranging from advanced manufacturing to culinary arts. Students have the opportunity to enroll in communications courses which includes broadcasting on the SICTC/EVSC radio station, WPSR, 90.7FM. The career center also offers pathways in Construction Technology, Engineering, Agriculture, and Transportation.
