

## WHAT COULD HAPPEN AS A RESULT OF THIS WORK?

- Schools, restaurants and other institutions will increase the amount of locally grown and produced foods in their food service
- Students, teachers, parents, school food-service directors and community members will increase their awareness of local food and agriculture systems
- Indiana farms will gain access to local markets

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## WHAT CAN YOU DO TO SUPPORT FARM TO SCHOOL EFFORTS IN INDIANA?

**Food Service Directors:** Tell your food distributor that you are interested in purchasing local food and supporting the local economy.

**Farmers and Producers:** Contact the food service director at your nearby school to learn the school's needs and when they need it.

**School Teachers:** Many curricula exist that allow teachers to integrate food and food system concepts into classroom learning. Network with other teachers and administrators about what your school or district could do to support Farm to School.

**Parents and Community Members:** Approach the school administration and school boards to communicate your support of Farm to School in your community. Volunteer in the classroom or the cafeteria.

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## WHAT IS FARM TO SCHOOL?

Farm to School programs connect farms with school cafeterias and classrooms. Farm to School activities include a wide range of purchasing and educational programs:

- Procuring locally grown foods as part of the school meals or snack program
- Using local foods in after school and summer nutrition programs
- Cooking and tasting demonstrations
- Facilitating farm visits or classroom visits by farmers
- Planting school gardens
- Teaching composting, waste management and agricultural science
- Workshops for growers, food-service personnel and teachers
