

Online Training Requirements:

- To be certified as a School Safety Specialist, Basic Training participants must review the content, and pass the assessments for all topics on the "Online Training For Basic Group" site
 - Quizzes must be taken and passed to get credit for each topic (a passing grade is 80% or higher)
- Online material can be viewed according to your own schedule, and can be viewed more than once (majority of videos are under 30 minutes)
- All topics must be reviewed, and assessments completed by **May 1, 2017**
- We cannot provide extensions except for major medical or family emergency

Purpose of online training:

- Eliminate the need for five days of onsite training using a time efficient method to deliver the same information
- Provide resources at your fingertips
- Provide professional development
 - Although program is password protected, this program is available for you to use when training others in your school
