**MOTION:** Upon a motion by Mrs. Moran and a second by Mrs. Stewart, the Board unanimously approved the application for the 1003 G School Improvement Grant (SIG).

Mrs. McCammon then invited Mr. Tom Forkner, president of the AFT, to speak on behalf of the support of the AFT for the application of the SIG.

Mr. Forkner stated that since an agreement away from the table has been reached between ACS and the AFT with regards to issues surrounding compliance for our priority focus schools and knowing that with that agreement, there is nothing that will now interfere applying for the SIG, the AFT is offering its support and encourages the board to move forward with the application of the SIG. Because there are already priority plans in place for Anderson High School and Highland Middle School, receiving funding would help us move forward with those plans and benefit our staff and students.

Mrs. Stewart, board secretary, stated that after serving for many years on the school board, it is gratifying to her to see the school board/ACS, and the AFT working together.

Mr. Forkner added that all of the groups have been working collaboratively. There have been a number of meetings already with Mrs. McCammon and several staff members, and administrative staff in the school buildings.

Mrs. Moran, board member, also stated that she appreciated the collaboration and the hard work for the betterment of the students and community.

Mr. Gale agreed that extra funding could go a long way in supporting the people who are working with our students and lead to improvement.

**B. Human Resources Report**

Dr. Smith presented the human resources report that was included in the agenda book and also passed out additional pages of items to be considered. He added that as of 4:45 pm, today, we are essentially staffed in all buildings except Anderson High School which has just a few available openings. There may also be a few more retirements and resignations that will need to be filled. He also explained that, under New Hires, those names with an asterisk are teachers who are being brought back for their second or third year under an emergency permit with the expectation that they will complete their licensing requirements to be fully licensed. He then asked for approval of Resolution, #R-2015-36.
