RE: Priority and Technical Dual Credit Crosswalks and FAQs, 2016-17

To better assist high schools in providing high-quality dual credit programs and offerings to students, IDOE, in collaboration with ICHE, are pleased to share the 2016-17 Dual Credit Crosswalks for Priority and Technical dual credit.

The purpose of the Crosswalks is intended to assist school personnel as they provide guidance to students regarding specific coursework in liberal arts and/or Career and Technical Education, college and career pathways, graduation plans and diploma requirements, and post-secondary planning.

The Dual Credit Crosswalks are **not an exclusive list** of all dual credit courses schools may offer to their students, but rather, the courses that have been approved through the Indiana Commission for Higher Education (ICHE) and Statewide Transfer and Articulation Committee (STAC) as part of the Priority and Technical Dual Credit list. **If a high school has a formal agreement with a college to award dual credit for these courses**, students may earn both high school credits and transcribed college credits as specified in the dual credit agreement. Per Indiana legislation, the college can charge high school students no more than \$25 per college credit for Priority and Technical Dual Credit courses taught by a high school instructor and the college receives funding as part of ICHE's Dual Credit biennium budget recommendation. Please note this funding is limited to public, state colleges and universities.
