The Purpose of the Advanced Placement (AP) Program in Indiana

Advanced Placement (AP) is a research-based method to facilitate student participation and success through delivery of college-level courses and corresponding exams in the high school setting to qualified high school students.

Testing Opportunities

The Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) will cover in full the exam fees for the 2016 Math, English Language Arts, and Science Advanced Placement (AP) exams taken by 11th and 12th grade Indiana students enrolled in the corresponding courses offered by accredited public and nonpublic schools. Please note: nonpublic schools must be state-accredited.

Exam fees should not be charged to students who qualify for free/reduced lunch, per I.C. 20-33-5. The federal AP Test Fee Grant will be utilized to cover most of this cost for non-math or-science AP exams taken by eligible students, and state funds will be used to cover the remainder. Please remember, to qualify for state coverage of AP exam fees, the IDOE requires students to complete both the AP course and corresponding exam during the school year.
