

**Choice Scholarship Program
Special Education Pathway
2018-2019 School Year**

Student must satisfy all criteria to qualify for the Choice Scholarship Program under the Special Education Pathway.

1. A student must:
 - a. Have legal settlement in Indiana;
 - b. Be between the ages of 5 and 22 by August 1st; **AND**
 - c. Be accepted for enrollment into a participating Choice Scholarship school.
2. A student must:
 - a. Have a disability that requires special education; **AND**
 - b. Have an Individualized Education Program (IEP), pursuant to IC 20-32, or an Individualized Service Plan (ISP), pursuant to 511 IAC 7-34, developed for the student.

AND

3. A student must be a member of a household with an annual income equal to or below 200% of the amount to qualify for the Federal Reduced Lunch Program.

For a household size of eleven (11) or more, add \$7,992 to the annual limit for each additional member for a 90% scholarship and add \$15,984 to the annual limit for each additional member for a 50% scholarship.

90% and 50% Choice Scholarships are 90% and 50% of the public tuition support amount of a student's public school corporation of legal settlement. 90% and 50% award amounts can be found at www.doe.in.gov/choice under Estimated Award Amounts by Corporation.
