Choice Scholarship Program Special Education Track 2021-2022 School Year

Student must satisfy all criteria to qualify for the Choice Scholarship Program under the Special Education Track

1. A student must:
 - a. Have legal settlement in Indiana;
 - b. Be between the ages of 5 and 22 by August 1;AND
 2. A student must:
 - a. Have a disability that requires special education;AND
 - b. Have an Individualized Education Program (IEP), pursuant to IC 20-32, or a Service Plan (SP), pursuant to 511 7-34, developed for the student.
- AND
3. A student must be a member of a household with an annual income equal to or below 200% of the amount to qualify the Federal Free or Reduced Price Lunch Program. (IC 20-51-1-4.3)
