Re: House Enrolled Act 1001 – Kindergarten Entrance and ADM Funding

Background:

The Indiana General Assembly amended I.C. 20-43-4-5 in May 2019 allowing school corporations to receive state funding for kindergarten (KG) students who are at least age five by October 1, 2020 for the 2020-2021 school year.

Note: I.C. 20-33-2-7 still requires a student to be at least five years of age on August 1 of the school year to participate in a KG program at a school corporation, unless the student is waived into kindergarten. School corporations may adopt an appeal procedure to allow a parent to request a “waiver” for a student who is not at least five years of age on August 1.

Guidance:

In determining average daily membership (ADM), each KG student who is at least five years of age on the date set forth below, will be provided ADM funding:

- For the 2020-2021 school year, October 1 of the school year.

In other words, if a student is waived into KG and is not at least age five by October 1 for the 2020-2021 school year, a school corporation shall not count the student for ADM and will not receive tuition support for the student.
