Reminder: Part B and Medicaid Funds Can Help Pay for Accelerated Learning and Recovery

In addition to those noted at IDOE's [Accelerated Learning](#) web page, IDEA Part B grants and federal Medicaid reimbursements can also be funding resources to support accelerated learning, learning recovery, and compensatory services. See Part B Allowable costs guidance at the Office of Special Education Moodle community, under Fiscal>Part B Grants for Special Education>Guidance.

Also, please remember: IndianaMAC allows public school corporations and charter schools to recover some of the costs to provide supports for students who need medical, including mental health, supports to participate in school (in person or virtually).

Does your LEA's IndianaMAC time study include all staff who (1) do any of the following activities, and (2) are funded, at least in part, with state and local dollars?

- arranging supports for students with medical (including mental health) needs
- coordinating with community partners to set up school-based or school-linked health services
- referring students to receive needed health, mental health, vision, dental, hearing services
- helping families who lost health coverage find/apply for public health plans/benefits
- setting up telehealth alternatives for students engaged in remote learning to continue receiving IEP or 504 plan services
- arranging for compensatory or extended school year therapy or other medical services per students' individualized education programs (IEPs)
