



Indiana Criminal Justice Institute **GRANT OPPORTUNITY**

Title II Formula Grant Program

Award Period: January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2021

Application Deadline: Wednesday, Nov. 4, 2020

The Indiana Criminal Justice Institute is making more than \$1 million in federal Title II funding available to assist Indiana state agencies, units of local government, non-profits, and schools with delinquency prevention, diversion, and juvenile justice intervention programs in 2021. Title II grants may be used to support direct service programs for at-risk youth and/or for justice system involved youth.

The Title II Formula Grant program requires each state to develop a three-year plan that identifies goals for the juvenile justice system and programmatic priorities to be supported by sub-grants. Title II sub-grant funding is competitive in nature. Therefore, ICJI will only give consideration to applications that fall under one of the following purpose areas AND have the greatest impact on Hoosier youth:

- Racial and Ethnic Disparities
- Diversion Programs
- Gender Specific Programs
- Mental Health Services for Youth in Custody
- Mentoring, Counseling, and Training Programs
- Rural Area Juvenile Programs
- Youth Substance Abuse and Alcohol Programs
- After-School Programs
- Delinquency Prevention
- Gangs
- Positive Youth Development
- Deinstitutionalization of Status Offenders
- Juvenile Justice System Improvement

Applicants must select only one purpose area per application; however, applicants may submit multiple applications if they wish to operate multiple programs and/or address multiple purpose areas. Neither the invitation to submit an application nor the use of ICJI staff for technical assistance implies that an applicant will receive a grant award. Continuation funding is not guaranteed from year to year. All awards are contingent upon availability of funds. There is a 10 percent match requirement for this grant opportunity.

IntelliGrants

To access the online application, the entity must be registered in IntelliGrants, [ICJI's grants-management system](#). Organizations that have already registered in IntelliGrants for another ICJI grant may add users for the Title II applications. For example, multiple departments within the same city, town or county government may need to work through one IntelliGrants administrator.

ICJI recommends that subgrantees review IntelliGrants material before registering and logging in for the first time. Use the password **IndianaCJI1** to register and view the [webinar recording](#).

Everyone who signs an ICJI grant agreement(s) must learn how to make electronic signatures in IntelliGrants. When an organization registers a new user, it should suggest a user role in the notes section. The user types are explained on page 6 of the [Subgrantee User Manual](#). Once an organization's users are registered and approved, it will be ready to submit applications for ICJI funding availabilities.
