This grant will develop many programs that will prevent delinquent behavior in many of our students, giving them the best chance to be productive adults in our society.

This grant will help fund the development and implementation of new programs, such as the Family Literacy Night, during which parents, students, and teachers can share creative activities to use at school and at home; Open Houses to meet parent needs; and Orientation events for incoming students at the Middle School and High School. The grant will also provide additional funds to support tutoring, homework assistance, and provide remediation support. These types of programs, that bring the community together, can make a significant difference to our youth and their parents.

The hiring of a Truancy Interventionist will also provide assistance to students and their families to increase overall attendance rates. Truancy has been linked to serious delinquent activity in youth, such as, gang activity, involvement in criminal activity, and substance abuse issues. Providing a Truancy Interventionist in the schools, will be instrumental in keeping the truancy rate down.

This School Improvement Grant will make a significant difference for our students, our teachers, and our community. The students of Anderson deserve the best, and this grant will meet the individual student needs and support the efforts of the teachers in helping our youth.


