Increased student achievement; research-based curriculum	The school budgeted \$151,941 to pay an additional 10% for staff salaries due to our extended calendar; \$98,172 for benefits; \$244,107.61 for Supplies	The school has further reduced staff allocated to this grant as we prepare to sustain our SIG plan without the grant, and we are continuing to invest the difference in research-based curricular programs which will be used to target specific academic needs which include reading intervention, online curriculum for credit recovery, curricular resources, and security devices to ensure the technology purchased through this grant will remain safely in the building for ongoing use by students and staff to impact instruction. The new amount to fund the additional 10% salary is \$126,941. The new benefits amount is \$78,172. The new Supplies budget is \$289,107.61.	The school is reducing this amount and allocating these expenses to other funds as it works to create a sustainability plan for the SIG work to continue following the grant cycle
