Additional Documentation Staff Training:

All certified staff members were involved in the submission of the grant proposal. Each was given the opportunity for input and has pledged support of implementation of the grant over the next 3 years. The addition of the five new “coach” positions provides an opportunity for current staff members to take on leadership roles if qualified. The principal is given the flexibility to look outside of the school and corporation to find the best candidates to lead in a coaching position. Coaches will model solid researched based instruction. Flexible hours will allow teachers to provide instruction before or after school hours.

Several teachers will be retiring at the end of the school year. The principal has been given the discretion of hiring only quality candidates without regard to seniority in order to fill vacant positions. Coaches will be assigned to work with classroom teachers in all areas of the curriculum. Specific focus will be given to those teachers new to the building or new to the profession. Those teachers currently with a strong content background who struggle with differentiation will receive coaching for appropriate delivery of instruction.

Student data will drive the placement of Coaches within classrooms. Data disaggregated to subgroups will provide focus of intentional instruction.

Five Building Level Instructional Coaches Sarah Scott Middle School – Title I 1003(g) School Improvement Grant

Scope of Employment

The five building level instructional coaches will provide high quality, job-embedded professional development for the three years of the grant. The coaches will support teachers and students in grades six, seven, and eight at Sarah Scott Middle School.

The coaches will report to Principal Bruce Lautenschlager. The coaches will hold valid Indiana teaching licenses and operate under policies of the Vigo County Board of School Trustees, including the current teacher contract. The coaches will work under a teacher contract with modified hours to address goals of the grant.

Job Responsibilities

- Models and co-teaches in classrooms at Sarah Scott Middle School as assigned by the building principal.
- Provides professional development for teachers during team periods and after school in the specific area of expertise (reading, writing, math, or data/engagement).
- Participates in intensive content and instruction training.
- Develops instructional units and lessons in area of expertise that are research-based and aligned with the current Indiana Academic Standards.
- Participates in staff development training sessions in spring/summer with other coaches.
- Assists with corporation in-service activities and other development activities as needed per district administration and the building principal.
- Assists in the development of curricular materials to promote student achievement for students, teachers, parents, and community members.
- Provides leadership in school improvement meetings to document progress toward school goals
- Grades, monitors and records student assessments in area of specialty.
- Assists the school and district in aligning after school programs with school goals.
- Performs other duties as needed by the principal to fulfill goals of the Title I 1003 (g) School Improvement Grant.
