Subject: 2021 Title I Comparability Report for SY 2020-2021

Date: September 17, 2020

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Sec. 1118 of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) states that a local educational agency may only receive Title I, A funding if state and locally funded services are at least comparable in Title I schools when compared to non-Title I schools. The Comparability Report, required by Office of Title Grants and Support, ensures that Indiana Local Education Agencies (LEAs) comply with regulatory requirements.

NOTE: For school year 2020-2021, only those LEAs whose corporation number ends in (5) will be reviewed and approved by IDOE. However, all LEAs should complete within the Title I app center and retain comparability reports since ESSA requires it annually. *Current year data* must be used when completing the comparability report. Typically, data are based on fall counts for enrollment and staffing. In any case, two criteria apply: (1) the data collection date being used by the LEA may be no later than October 1, 2020; and (2) all data reported--enrollments, staff FTEs/salaries--must reflect conditions as of the *same* date.

For the purpose of comparability alone, the LEA shall report 1.0 FTE non-certified staff as 0.5, as the value of a full-time non-certified staff is not equal to the value of a full-time certified staff member. If a non-certified staff member is 0.5 for FTE, then for comparability, the LEA shall report half of that as 0.25. Also, staff members funded through federal programs, such as Title I or IDEA, are not included in the staff member count. Only state or locally funded staff are included.

LEAs with only one school building in each grade span (e.g., K-6, 7-8, 9-12; or K-12; etc.) or a total enrollment of 1,000 students or less are exempt from calculating comparability. However, those LEAs must still submit a comparability report including school and enrollment data to verify an exempt status. Please note, the supplement not supplant methodology is a different fiscal test under ESSA, and the requirements for it are different than comparability.

Comparability reports are due to the State Education Agency (SEA) on or before **October 30, 2020**. Every LEA will complete the comparability report online. General instructions are provided on the <u>Comparability Online Application Guide</u>.

Online reporting is currently open, and may be accessed through the <u>Title I Application Center</u>.

Any building reported as not comparable by October 30, 2020 must be brought into compliance no later than December 30, 2020. A revised comparability report must be completed and submitted along with documented evidence of how comparability has been met.
